It's like a light finally went on and now I am understanding it better than I ever have. It's becoming a habit much like an exercise routine. If I don't read the Bible my day doesn't go as well and it feels like something from my day is missing. According to the website <u>Science: How Stuff Works</u> it takes 30 days to form a habit. So for 30 days I am trying to make time to sit and read the Bible. Maybe once my habit is formed after 30 days I will reach my goal and finish the New Testament. Will you join me in my challenge and for 30 days read the Bible?
