FROM PASTOR ALEX WOLF

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

We've arrived back to football season! High school football can again be seen on Fridays, college football can be seen on Saturdays and professional football can be seen on Sundays. With the beginning of the football season, each team begins at 0 wins and 0 losses. Each team aspires to win all their games, win the championship, and go down in the annals of history as the greatest team ever.

But the reality is that most teams don't achieve those lofty goals. Those of us who are Nebraska Cornhusker fans feel like we've been punished in exile since 2002. Husker football fans have seen some dark days and we've cried out, "How long until we are on top of the college football world again?" At times hope is hard to find. Husker hopes are now placed in Scott Frost's hands. Can we still feel the hope?

Whether or not Nebraska football makes it back to the promised land of college football glory any time soon, the people of God can certainly hold on to hope. For the last month and a half, we've been looking at the messages of the ancient prophets in Sunday worship. The messages of Isaiah, Amos, Hosea, and Micah have been bitter-sweet. Often the prophets have said words condemning the sinful actions or inactions of God's people resulting in dark days. The prophets' words about dark days hit home the most with me. As I look around our nation and the world, things don't seem to be all that good. People are killing innocent bystanders by the dozens, we are in an extremely divisive political climate, and the world is stressed over numerous issues. But the prophets did not speak only of dark days. They also spoke of hope about a day of peace, joy and restoration.

In the context of Jeremiah 29, King Jehoiachin and his royal court had been led away from Jerusalem to the nation of Babylon as exiles. With their national leader in enemy chains, the citizens of Judah, both those exiled in Babylon and those remaining in Jerusalem, must have thought this was the end. But the prophet Jeremiah wrote a letter to reassure the people that God had not forgotten or abandoned them. One of the most popular verses in Scripture is Jeremiah 29:11, where God speaks through Jeremiah, "'For I know the plans I have for you,' declares the Lord, 'plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future.'" God's plans for his people involve prosperity, peace, and goodness. When the people cried out to God from their dark places, God promised to hear them and restore them (Jer. 29:12-14).

If times are tough and things aren't going your way in life, if you are having some dark days, don't give up. Hold on to the hope and promise that God hasn't forgotten or abandoned you. The day is coming, God says, when he will bring peace, joy and restoration to his people. We can trust in God's promises.





