Fall 2019 Sermon Series Continues.... "We Believe: The Apostles' Creed"

For centuries, the Apostles' Creed has been one of the most important statements that outline the framework of the Christian faith. Every Sunday in churches around the world, Christians gather and recite in unison the Apostles' Creed. But do they understand what they're saying? Do these ancient beliefs connect to our daily lives? How do they shape our identity and worldview? Join us on Sundays this fall as we make this ancient statement of faith come alive! Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

In the month of November, families and friends throughout the United States gather together for Thanksgiving. The Thanksgiving holiday is a time that involves family time, parades, lots of delicious food, naps after eating this delicious food, and often intense travel plans.

The history of Thanksgiving is a bit complicated. Setting aside days for giving thanks have occurred throughout human history. The first documented thanksgiving services occurring in territory currently belonging to the United States were held by Spanish and French settlers in the 1500s. Thanksgiving services were held in the Virginia colony as early as 1607. Americans are taught in school about the "First Thanksgiving" when the English Pilgrims shared a meal with the local Native Americans to celebrate the harvest at Plymouth, Massachusetts in October 1621. Presidents George Washington, John Adams, and James Madison declared days of thanksgiving during their presidencies. But it was during Abraham Lincoln's presidency in October 1863 that Thanksgiving was to be observed annually in the United States. In the midst of a terrible war, President Lincoln proclaimed a national day of "Thanksgiving and Praise to our beneficent Father who dwelleth in the Heavens."

Christians have many reasons to thank God. We can thank God for creating us (Psalm 100:3), for loving us (1 Chronicles 16:34), and for satisfying our needs (Psalm 107:8-9). When we collect the offering on Sunday mornings, we sing "Praise God from whom all blessings flow." This hymn reminds us of this great truth: God is the ultimate source of all things. The apostle Paul wrote to the Colossian church, "And whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him" (Col. 3:17). As Christians, we can express our thankfulness in every part of our daily lives. Even in difficult and hard times, we can always find something to be thankful for. Paul wrote to the Thessalonian church, "Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus" (1 Thess. 5:16-18). If you don't know what to be thankful for, start with the small things. Give thanks for the new day, for the sunshine, maybe even for your cup of coffee. Before long, you'll see God's many blessings in your life. As the old hymn goes, "When upon life's billows you are tempest tossed, when you are discouraged, thinking all is lost, count your many blessings, name them one by one, and it will surprise you what the Lord hath done."

As we gather around the table this Thanksgiving, as we look at our family and friends, the food on our tables, the roof over our heads, may we give thanks for all the people who helped bring that moment together. And may we give thanks and honor to God, the One who created us, the One who redeemed us, and the One who sustains us in all that we do. This November and always, may we give thanks with a grateful heart!

MEDICARE PRESCRIPTION DRUG AND HEALTH PLAN OPEN ENROLLMENT

It's that time again – the Medicare Prescription Drug and Health Plans Annual Open Enrollment Period starts OCTOBER 15 and ends DECEMBER 7! The 2020 plans' information will be on the Medicare website and the best way to determine how the changes will affect you and determine which plan will be best for you next year is to use Medicare's Plan Finder at <u>www.medicare.gov</u>.

Volunteers Assisting Seniors (VAS), of which Rick Scofield is a volunteer, is providing assistance for seniors and caregivers during the open enrollment period between October 15 and December 7 at enrollment events in the area and at the VAS office located at 42nd and Center St. VAS will also be hosting "signup cafes" for those who want to use the Medicare website themselves but may want assistance. A schedule of these events and appointments is available by calling VAS at 402-444-6617.

Rick is a trained volunteer with the Nebraska Senior Health Insurance Information Program (SHIIP) and will again provide assistance at the church. Rick will schedule appointment dates and times to be at the church. Please call Cheryl at the church office to schedule an appointment with him. Also late afternoon or early evening by appointment. Call Rick (402-493-5994) for more information. Also, if you're approaching 65 or retirement Rick can provide Medicare counseling about the decisions you need to make.
