Church family: we have a fabulous opportunity to help the Lydia House build a new therapy section of their campus: an Art Therapy Studio!









# FROM PASTOR ALEX WOLF

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

Well, the hits just keep coming, don't they? As we continue to deal with all the issues of this year, we are all exhausted. And we don't have our usual escapes to soothe our frustration (like no Nebraska Husker football or volleyball this Fall). The COVID-19 pandemic continues and we still aren't sure an end is in sight. Six months into this unusual season and we still don't know what tomorrow brings. I don't know about you, but I sometimes become afraid we'll never get out of this.

But let us not let fear drive our lives. The most common command in the Bible is "do not be afraid," written 365 times. That's a daily reminder from God to live everyday fearless, trusting God is still in control. According to my old professor, Mark Krause, in his commencement address to the 2020 graduating class of Nebraska Christian College, the second most common command in the Bible is "remember," written 247 times. I believe these two commands go hand in hand. How do we overcome our fear? We no longer fear because we remember.

After the Exodus event and before they entered the promised land of Canaan, the Lord commanded the Israelites through Moses to "remember how the Lord your God led you all the way in the desert these forty years..." (Deuteronomy 8:2). The Israelites had much fear and trepidation as they prepared to enter the land of Canaan, but the Lord told them to *remember* how he had been with them, rescued them from slavery in Egypt, and watched over them and provided for them. And if they remembered how the Lord guided them then, they do not need to be afraid that God would abandon them now. The Israelites were to *remember* what the Lord did for them every year through the Passover celebration. Through remembering, the Israelites were not afraid but trusted in God.

In a similar way, Jesus took the bread and the cup of the Passover meal and made them symbols for us to "remember" the significance of his death (Luke 22:19; 1 Corinthians 11:23-26). Whenever we eat the bread and drink the cup, we *remember* God's love for us shown in Jesus. When we gather on Sunday mornings, we *remember* Jesus' resurrection and his victory over the grave. We can be confident going forward because we remember the past.

Whatever difficult circumstance we face, whether its COVID-19, loss of a job, death of a loved one, or simply the uncertainty of what comes next, may we not be afraid because we remember how God has been faithful in the past and God's Spirit is with us and is faithful to us now. Let us not be afraid by remembering. In Christ's love.

# Exodus: Journey with God Fall 2020 Sermon Series

The second part in a narrative series takes the plot into deeper themes and often includes a major event that changes everything going forward. The book of Exodus continues the story of Abraham's descendants in Egypt, now threatened by an evil Pharaoh. A man named Moses has been called by God to lead God's people to freedom. The book of Exodus is a story for the ages.

#### **PETER & JOHN (Acts 4:1-22)**

Peter and John saw a man who was lame begging for money outside the temple. It was the only way the man had to meet his needs. Peter didn't give him money. Instead, he healed the man in Jesus' name! The council leaders didn't want Peter and John talking about the Resurrection or healing in Jesus' name. So they put them in prison. The crowd, who had seen the lame walking and thanking God, were praising God for the Miracle. The council let Peter and John go with a warning to stop talking about Jesus. Peter told them, "We can't stop talking about what we have seen and heard!"

#### What Do You Think?

How did Jesus feel about people in need? Did he help them? How do you think the man that was healed felt when he stood for the first time?


#### **FAMILY ACTIVITY**

Talk about how you as a family can help people in need without giving money. What do you have that you can share? Do you have a local nonprofit organization that helps people in need? Does your church have a program to help people in need? Think about ways you can help these programs.

#### Prayer

Dear God, thank you for caring about people in need. Help us find ways we can show your love to others. In Jesus' Name we pray, Amen.

### PETER in PRISON (Acts 12:1-17)

King Herod didn't like the disciples talking about Jesus, so he started bullying the church leaders. He threw Peter in jail. But the church was together, praying for Peter. An angel came to Peter in the night and helped him escape. Peter went to the house where the church was praying. When he knocked on the gate, a servant named Rhoda answered. She was so excited that she forgot to open the gate! The church came out to see Peter, and he told them about the angel helping him escape. Peter told the church to share how God had taken care of him and keep praying. Then Peter left to continue sharing the good news.

#### What Do You Think?

Peter thought the angel was a dream at first. How do you think he felt when he realized he was free? How would you have felt if you had been with the church praying when Peter showed up?

#### **FAMILY ACTIVITY**

Talk about how we can pray to God, and God hears and answers our prayers. What do you want to pray about? Share these things with your family, and pray for these things together.

#### Prayer

Dear God, thank you for listening to our prayers and answering. Help us listen carefully for your answers. In Jesus' Name we pray, Amen.

**Story Chain** (puzzle). King Herod didn't want Peter talking about Jesus, so he threw Peter in jail. Cut out the four strips. Put them in order of the story. Then connect them as a paper chain.

# An angel helped Peter escape from the prison.

Peter went and told the church about his escape.

King Herod put Peter in jail for talking about Jesus.

The church met together to pray for Peter.

## PAUL is CHANGED (Acts 9:1-19)

A man named Saul had made it his mission to throw in jail all the people who believed in Jesus. He was very cruel to the church. One day on his way to Damascus, a bright light shone down on him. Saul fell to his knees. Then a voice from heaven said, "Saul, why are you bullying me?" Saul realized that Jesus was talking to him. The men with him helped him to Damascus, because Saul was blind. God told a man named Ananias, who loved God, to go help Saul. Ananias obeyed God. Saul was filled with the Holy Spirit, and his sight was restored.

#### What Do You Think?

How do you think Saul felt when Jesus, the person he had been bullying, spoke to him? How do you think Ananias felt when God told him to go help Saul?


#### **FAMILY ACTIVITY**

Talk about how Saul's life totally changed when Jesus spoke to him. Saul was given a new mission: take the good news to the Gentiles. How has knowing Jesus changed your life? What plans do you think God has for your family? Is there a special group of people you could share the good news with?

#### Prayer

Dear God, thank you for loving us just the way we are. Show us what we can change in our lives to bring us closer to God. In Jesus' Name we pray, Amen.

Change Hate to Love (puzzle). Paul hated the followers of Jesus, and he was very cruel to them. But one day, Jesus spoke to him and everything changed. Change the word "hate" into the word "love." You can only change one letter at a time. Three of the letters will stay the same, and the empty box is the letter you need to change. TIP; For #3, read Matthew 7:3-5 in your Bible. The word for #3 is another way of saying the word "splinter" in Matthew.

## PAUL ESCAPES (Acts 9:20-25)

God showed great love to Paul, and that love changed Paul's whole life. With the power of the Holy Spirit, Paul began to preach in the synagogues and share his good news. He told everyone that once he persecuted anyone who followed Jesus, because he had hate in his heart. But Jesus spoke to him, and that hate turned to love. He had a new mission, to share the good news of Jesus. But not everyone believed Paul had changed. Some even plotted to kill him. Paul's new friends helped him escape by lowering him in a basket to the outside of the city wall, and Paul kept preaching.

#### What Do You Think?

Do you think you would have believed that Paul had totally changed? How can God change hate into love?

#### **FAMILY ACTIVITY**

Talk about the change in Paul's life. Why do you think Jesus spoke to Paul when Paul was treating the church cruelly? What can you as a family do to show God's love to those around you? Make a list of ways to show love. Talk about the opportunities you have each day to show love to others.

#### Prayer

Loving God, thank you for loving us, even when we're not lovable. Show us how to love others like you love us. In Jesus' Name we pray, Amen.


#### Basket for Paul (activity)


#### Materials:

- ∞ Paper lunch bags
- ∞ Yarn
- Single-hole punch
- ∞ Colors

#### Directions:

- ∝ Set your paper lunch bag up.
- ∝ Cut about 1/3 of the bag off from the top, which is close to the opening.
- ∞ Fold about an inch down on the outside of the bag around the opening.
- ω Use a single-hole punch to punch out holes around the top on the folded down part.
- ∞ Thread yarn in and out of the holes around the bag.
- α Tie the ends of a long piece of yarn to the middle of the two short sides.
