We are excited to bless TWO community partners: Big Brothers/Big Sisters is supported by Thrift World, and Y.E.S. (Youth Emergency Services) is supported by Tip Top Thrift. <u>During May, we will be collecting gently-used toys and children's and teen's clothing items</u>. Collection bins are in the Commons. Here is some information from the respective websites of both organizations to help bring understanding of their heart and community impact:

#### Y.E.S. (Youth Emergency Services)

Our Mission: Youth Emergency Services assists youth experiencing homelessness and near homelessness by providing critically-needed resources which support them in their desire to be self-sufficient. Basically, we help youth in crisis get back on their feet in whatever ways we can. After meeting their immediate needs for food, shelter, clothing and safety, we create a support system which helps them flourish.

<u>Our Vision</u>: We envision a community which understands and embraces its youth, creating an environment where youth homelessness no longer exists.

At first, YES was led strictly by volunteers who invited youth in crisis to stay in their homes. In time, it was decided it was time to invest in a home, which became known as the YES house. The YES House (known today as the Emergency Shelter) has been serving youth in crisis for over 40 years. YES added its Street Outreach Program in 1999. YES launched its Transitional Living Program (TLP) and Maternity Home in 2008. YES started its Rapid Rehousing program in 2019.

#### **Big Brothers/Big Sisters**

Big Brothers Big Sisters makes meaningful, monitored matches between adult volunteers ("Bigs") and children ("Littles"), ages 7 through 21, throughout the Omaha/Council Bluffs metro area. We develop positive friendships that have a direct and lasting effect on the lives of young people.

<u>VISION:</u> All youth achieve their full potential. <u>MISSION:</u> Create and support one-to-one mentoring relationships that ignite the power and *promise of* youth.

ACCOUNTABILITY: By partnering with parents/ guardians, volunteers, and others in the community we are accountable for each child in our program achieving:

- Higher aspirations, greater confidence, and better relationships
- Avoidance of risky behaviors
- Educational success

#### FROM PASTOR ALEX WOLF

Grace and peace to you in the name of the risen Christ!

I thought we had a wonderful Easter celebration in April. We had singing, praising, beautiful flowers, and smiling faces (under masks, of course!). Easter Sunday is a triumphant day when we rejoice in God's victory over death and evil through Jesus' rising from the dead. Christ's death and resurrection are the centerpiece of the Christian faith. It brings us wonderful joy and hope.

While Jesus' resurrection is a glorious event, we can't help but admit that the effects of sin and death can still be felt in the world around us. We've seen it recently in so many COVID-19 related deaths, in multiple shootings, in hate and violence committed toward people of differing skin colors. We see and experience it through hunger and thirst, through broken relationships, through emotional and physical abuse. We each bear scars from the brokenness of our world.

What's interesting to me is that Jesus, risen from the grave, still bears the scars of the cross on his hands and side. The disciple Thomas touched Jesus' wounds (see John 20:24-31). Jesus' scars tell us that he knows our pain. Though he was in the form of God, he became like us (see Philippians 2:6-8). He knows what it's like to suffer and be scarred. He knows what it's like to be human. While his scars tell us that we as humans endure hardships and suffering, his resurrection shows that he has overcome them. Jesus' scars are not a defect, but a testimony to his victory over the forces of evil. Through his own suffering and pain, Jesus identifies with what we're going through. And through his resurrection, Jesus brings us through our darkest times to light and life.

Easter is often a grand celebration, but it can be a difficult time for those still experiencing their own Good Friday. The scars on the hands and side of the resurrected Jesus show us how he sits in the ashes with us, mourns with us, and shares our burdens with us. Whether he has already and will someday soon, he also shares with us joy and new life, scars and all. Hold on to that hope, hold on to Jesus, the One crucified and risen, the One who knows you and walks with you through the darkest valleys all the way to the mountain tops.


May 2—"Grace" – Ephesians 2:1-10

May 9—"Salvation" – Colossians 1:15-23


May 16—"Exalt" - Philippians 2:1-11

May 23—Pentecost: "Filled with Power" - Acts 18:24-19:7


May 30-"Doubt" - John 20:24-29
