

FROM PASTOR ALEX WOLF

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

In July, the General Synod of the United Church of Christ (UCC) convened their 33rd meeting. The General Synod is the biennial meeting of representatives from UCC congregations, conferences, and organizations across the nation. The General Synod together elects the national officers and seeks the Holy Spirit's guidance to determine the direction of the general programming of the denomination. From 1957 in Cleveland, Ohio to 2019 in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, General Synod met in a physical location throughout the United States. This year was different. Because of the pandemic, this year's General Synod was virtual.

Despite being virtual, the diversity of the UCC was still on display. Through all the plenaries, committees, workshops, and other meetings held via Zoom, people from various church groups, backgrounds, and theological positions still gathered together as the body of Christ.

When I mention to someone that I'm a pastor in the United Church of Christ, they often ask what the UCC is like. I admit that I struggle a bit with the answer. We're not Baptist, Methodist, nor Lutheran. I often say we're congregational, but there's more to it than that. Our executive conference minister, the Rev. Brigit Stevens, put it, I think, in the best way I've heard it so far: we live in covenant. What does it mean that we live in covenant? It means we function like a family.

Every congregation within the United Church of Christ is autonomous, meaning, we determine for ourselves how we worship and act as the church in our own unique setting. But we are not self-governed. The authority of the church belongs to her sole Head, Jesus Christ. We are all accountable to Christ. Yet, we believe Christ has authorized us to be his servants in the world. We share authority not only with Christ but with our sibling congregations. We are not only accountable to Christ but also to each other. We love one another, we rejoice with, bear with, disagree with, and forgive one another. We are not separate from one another, yet we do not exercise a hierarchy that regulates from the top-down. No, we are a covenant family that walks together in all of God's ways. This can sometimes be tough to do. Like families, we do not always see eye-to-eye on various things, yet we strive to be one in Jesus Christ.

This is a good reminder for the church, both on the national and local levels. We worship, work, and play as one people in Jesus Christ. We are a family. General Synod, conference and association gatherings, and weekly Sunday worship are family reunions. We gather as the children of God to live in covenant. It can sometimes be messy, families sometimes are, but what would we do without our family?












Me after watching 12 minutes of
