LOOKING AHEAD.... OCTOBER MISSION OUTREACH


We have an opportunity this year to be a witness to the neighborhood! Halloween falls on a Sunday this year, so


In his writings, the prophet Isaiah spoke to the people of Israel as they lived in exile in Babylon. "Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past. See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the desert and streams in the wasteland" (Isaiah 43:18-19). Through the prophet's words, God spoke to the Israelites and told them to look for God to bring them home through another exodus-like event. God was doing a new thing with them.

If you aren't currently starting something new, perhaps keep a look out for what God could be doing in your life. As the author of Lamentations wrote, God's mercies "are new every morning" (Lam. 3:23).




Sermon Topics and Scriptures for September

1) What kind of worship will this second service be?

This second service will provide a Spirit-filled, contemporary worship experience centered around the Gospel of Jesus Christ. The service will include recorded praise music, Scripture, a message, and prayer.

2) Why a second worship service?

Our current 9:30 service serves those who appreciate a classical, traditional style of worship. A contemporary service allows those in our congregation who seek to worship God in a different way a meaningful avenue to do so. A contemporary service could also be an entry point into our congregation for younger visitors and families.

3) When and where will it be held?

11:00 a.m. on Sunday mornings in the sanctuary.

4) What about Sunday School?
