Decoration Day: On May 5, 1868, General John A. Logan, leader of an organization for Northern Civil War veterans, called for a nationwide day of remembrance later that month. "The 30th of May, 1868, is designated for the purpose of strewing with flowers, or otherwise decorating the graves of comrades who died in defense of their country during the late rebellion, and whose bodies now lie in almost every city, village and hamlet churchyard in the land," he proclaimed.

with friends, while working toward Northwest Hills' October Craft Show!


MEN'S MINISTRY BREAKFAST

FROM PASTOR ALEX WOLF

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

Whew! We made it! The church has been filled with praises and "alleluias!" Empty plastic eggs are scattered across the floor. Candy wrappers have caused the garbage can to overflow. Sunday's best clothes are crumpled up in the laundry basket. The leftover ham and scalloped potatoes are cooling in the fridge. But wait! Easter isn't over. Easter has just begun!

One day a year just isn't enough to celebrate the great foundation of our faith. We don't just shout "Christ is risen!" and then go back to what we were doing. No, the Easter celebration in the church lasts seven weeks, a total of fifty days that stretches from Easter Sunday to Pentecost Sunday. The party is just getting started!

Easter being a season of fifty days is patterned after the Jewish festival of weeks, or Shavuot. Shavuot is celebrated seven weeks after Passover and signaled the end of the wheat harvest. It's also associated with the giving of the Torah on Mount Sinai. Shavuot later became known as Pentecost, which means "fiftieth day" in Greek.

In addition, the number seven has been connected with wholeness or completion (i.e., the seven days of creation). A period of seven weeks, each consisting of seven days, suggests completeness twofold. Seven weeks is roughly one-seventh of a year. So, just as the seventh day of the week is holy to God, one-seventh of the year is set apart as a holy season to celebrate Christ's resurrection.

The number fifty also has significant meaning. Leviticus 25 designates every fiftieth year as a time of jubilee, when captives are to be released and debts are to be forgiven. Easter, then, represents the "great jubilee," in which Jesus frees us from captivity and debt to sin.

The season of Easter is to be an extended time of joy and celebration in the church. Our Lord Jesus was crucified and has been raised from the dead. We as Christians believe the resurrection to be the greatest event in human history. So, go ahead and celebrate! Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!


Congratulations!

One of our members (thanks, Anna!) thought it would be nice to occasionally share some bits of our church's history in the Newsletter—especially since we've been adding new people—so they can gain insight from knowing a bit about our history. Here's a little segment from our 50-Year Anniversary booklet from 2015:

"Northwest Hills Church is a member of the United Church of Christ. The denomination was brought into being by a merger of the Congregational Christian with Evangelical and Reformed Churches in the USA at the national level in 1957. In Nebraska 1962, a vote was taken at the Annual Conference to effect the merger.

The congregation of Northwest Hills UCC came about through the merger of four small churches. They were: First Congregational Church of Irvington and Third Congregational (Plymouth) Church of Omaha who merged forming Northwest Congregational Church UCC in 1961. Western Hills United Church of Christ merged with them in 1968 and the name was changed to Northwest Hills Church UCC. Finally, in 1995, Central Park Congregational Church became a part of the fellowship...

There are a number of reasons we have all found our way together, as a body of Christ at Northwest Hills Church. The primary purpose, of course, is to make more effective a common witness to Christ as well as to fulfill the spiritual needs of persons in the community, and to serve the Lord while advancing God's kingdom in the world."


