

## FROM PASTOR ALEX WOLF

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

As a millennial, I'll admit I spend more time on the internet and social media than I should. Because I'm on social media a lot. I've noticed people write and comment more and more cruel and hurtful words. Do you remember the old adage, "Sticks and stone may break my bones, but words can never hurt me"? I've never bought into that saying. Words can be powerful weapons against someone. As Christians, we are told to watch what we say. The Bible is filled with warnings about the power of our tongues.

In Scripture, the tongue is compared to a sharpened razor (Psalm 52:2) and said to not be easily controlled (James 3:6-8). It can either build up or tear down, pour out blessings or throw out scathing curses. Words have a serious impact on us and others. They can follow us around for our whole lives, penetrating deep into the heart. You can say a million wonderful things about someone, but one hurtful word may erase all of what was previously said in an instant.

The apostle James uses three images when writing about the tongue. The first two are a bit in a horse's mouth and a ship's rudder (James 3:4-5a). Both help steer one direction or another, just like how both the words and actions of ourselves and others shape and guide us. The third image is of a spark (3:5b-6). A spark can quickly turn into a raging fire if left unchecked. The same can be of our tongues. Our words can spread beyond our control and leave us powerless to stop the consequences or undo damage. For example, an unfounded rumor might ruin a person's reputation if found false. For good or for evil, our words have power.

We should follow Scripture's teaching and think twice before we speak ("Everyone should be guick to listen, slow to speak..." James 1:19). We should listen thoroughly before answering ("To answer before listening—that is folly and shame" Proverbs 18:13). We should speak truthfully ("Truthful lips endure forever, but a lying tongue lasts only a moment" Proverbs 12:19). We should speak courteously and kindly ("Let your conversations be always full of grace, seasoned with salt, so that you may know how to answer everyone" Colossians 4:6). And our words should be sweet ("Gracious words are a honeycomb, sweet to the soul and healing to the bones" Proverbs 16:24).

Our words matter. That's why we must be careful with what we say. May we use our tongue, with God's help, to build others up and give glory to God. May our prayer be that of the psalmist, "Let the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be acceptable in your sight, O Lord, my rock and my redeemer."

(Psalm 19:14)

We've had some new folks joining our NWH family on a regular basis, so we'll be sharing a bit of our heritage as we wind down 2022 (can you believe it?!)

The following are excerpts from the 2015 50th Anniversary booklet. Enjoy!

Our Purpose: Our purpose is to fulfill God's ministry through the loving spirit and teachings of Christ.

Born of a marriage of churches and denominations, Northwest Hills Church is a diverse people growing in a changing world and united by a common goal of loving and sharing in the life of Jesus.

It is our goal to accomplish our mission by encouraging affirmation of faith as it relates to contemporary living. Through Christian Education for all ages, we are dedicated to promoting individual and family growth in an attitude of involvement, mutual support, and application of Christ-like values.

By Reaching out to others, at home and around the world, with love and respect, support and acceptance, we are committed to bringing some measure of relief to all forms of human suffering and ignorance. We seek to contribute responsible leadership in times of crisis, whether that crisis be individual, local, or global.

Awareness is an avenue along which our ministry also chooses travel. The exchange of timely and appropriate information and usage of the church facilities to nourish and participate in concerns, important within the community, is a significant function of Northwest Hills.

We plan to support the challenges of this mission through responsible stewardship, emphasizing free and unreserved giving of our time, talent and treasure for the work of our Lord.

To this mission, we, the people of Northwest Hills Church United Church of Christ pledge ourselves.

**Mission Statement**: In response to the invitation of God, we join others in joyfully receiving, participating in, and sharing in the love, forgiveness, and hope available to all through faith in Jesus Christ. In harmony with God's purposes as revealed in the scriptures, through the Holy Spirit and in Jesus Christ, we find fulfillment for our lives through the meaningful use of our God-given abilities and resources in our daily lives, in worship, and in service to others.

**History of Northwest Hills Church United Church of Christ, 9334 Fort Street**: Northwest Hills Church is a member of the United Church of Christ. The denomination was brought into being by a merger of the

Congregational Christian with Evangelical and Reformed Church in the U.S.A. at the national level in 1957. In Nebraska 1962, a vote was taken at the Annual Conference to effect the merger.

The congregation of Northwest Hills United Church of Christ came about through the merger of four small churches. They were: First Congregational Church of Irvington and Third Congregational (Plymouth) Church of Omaha who merged forming Northwest Congregational Church UCC in 1961. Western Hills United Church of Christ merged with them in 1968 and the name was changed to Northwest Hills Church United Church of Christ. Finally, in 1995, Central Park Congregational Church became a part of the fellowship.

The membership has been added to in a variety of ways through the years: people moving into the area; others who shared like backgrounds; some came by invitation from members; and others through the ministry of the pastoral staff during times of deep need.

There are a number of reasons we have all found our way together, as a body of Christ at Northwest Hills Church. The primary purpose, of course, is to make more effective a common witness to Christ as well as to fulfill the spiritual needs of persons in the community, and to serve the Lord while advancing God's kingdom in the world.
