#### NOVEMBER/DECEMBER MISSION & SERVICE COLLECTION PROJECT

For the months of November and December, Northwest Hills Church will be partnering with the Salvation Army to collect new and gently-used men's, women's, and children's warm winter coats to support the Salvation Army Winter Night Watch.

The Salvation Army Winter Night Watch brings help directly to the Streets of Omaha. The Midwest winter's frigid temperatures along with snow, ice and



wind can make survival a challenge for Omaha's homeless and near-homeless population. Five nights a week between December and February, the Salvation Army's mobile food trucks make multiple stops across the city to distribute hot meals and beverages, as well as winter coats, gloves, hats, socks and blankets to anyone in need. Last year Winter Night Watch provided more than 8,000 meals and hundreds of winter outerwear items to those struggling to survive the harsh winter. Especially needed: men's sizes XL, 2XL and 3XL. 

#### FROM PASTOR ALEX WOLF

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

Fall is my favorite time of the year. The leaves are turning beautiful, vibrant colors. The reds, yellows and browns excite my eyes as they fall from the trees. The air is cool and crisp, which brings to mind thoughts of cozy blankets and steaming bowls of soup. The children who attend our preschool come in their cute tiny jackets and mittens. Families are headed off to have fun at pumpkin patches. The weekends are filled with football. And Christmas is right around the corner!

But before we get to Christmas, we need to remember a major holiday before it: Thanksgiving. The Thanksgiving holiday has become a quick day of family gatherings, over-eating, and football. By the end of the day, we move on to Christmas shopping and the like. Thanksgiving comes and goes so quickly, we take for granted the significance of the holiday, of actually "giving thanks."

In his letter to the Colossian church, the apostle Paul prays that God fill the people in Colossae with the knowledge of God's will so that they may live a life worthy and pleasing to God. Paul lists four characteristics of what a worthy and pleasing life looks like in the following verses. The last characteristic Paul lists is "giving joyful thanks to [God] the Father" (Col. 1:12).

This is a great reminder for us. Our Christian lives should be full of thanksgiving to God. Let us give thanks to God, for he has been good to us and blessed us with many blessings. I encourage you to take a few moments and give thanks for what God has done in your life. Even when you find yourself in the midst of life's battles, even when things feel like they're falling apart, there is still much to be thankful for in our lives. Simply start as I did in the beginning of this letter. Thank God for the trees and the leaves and the beauty of creation. Thank God for the warmth of blankets. Thank God for family and friends. Before long, you'll have a whole list for which to be thankful. Most importantly, let's be thankful for what God has done for us in Jesus. The apostle Paul reminded the Colossians (and us!) that through Jesus, we are the beloved children of God who "have redemption, the forgiveness of sins" (Col. 1:12-14). As the old hymn goes, "When upon life's billows you are tempest tossed, when you are discouraged, thinking all is lost, count your many blessings, name them one by one, and it will surprise you what the Lord hath done."

Know that I am thankful to God for all of you here at Northwest Hills Church and the ministry we share.

#### MEDICARE PRESCRIPTION DRUG AND HEALTH PLAN OPEN ENROLLMENT

It's that time again – the Medicare Prescription Drug and Health Plans Annual Open Enrollment Period starts OCTOBER 15 and ends DECEMBER 7! The 2023 plans' information will be on the Medicare website and the best way to determine how the changes will affect you and determine which plan will be best for you next year is to use Medicare's Plan Finder at www.medicare.gov.

Statewide Senior Health counseling will be providing assistance only via phone due to Covid again this year. Call 402-444-6617 and Volunteers Assisting Seniors will set up a PHONE appointment. Rick Scofield (who is an official VAS Volunteer) has kindly agreed to help those in our congregation by phone <u>after October 30th</u>. Also, if you're approaching 65 or retirement, Rick can provide Medicare counseling about the decisions you need to make.
