MISSION & SERVICE DECEMBER PROJECT

The Salvation Army Winter Night Watch brings help directly to the Streets of Omaha. The Midwest winter's frigid temperatures along with snow, ice and wind can make survival a challenge for Omaha's homeless and near-homeless population. Five nights a week between December and February, the Salvation Army's mobile food trucks make multiple stops across the city to distribute hot meals and beverages, as well as winter coats, gloves, hats. socks and blankets to anyone in need. Last year Winter Night Watch provided more than 8,000 meals

and hundreds of winter outerwear items to those struggling to survive the harsh winter.





# FROM PASTOR ALEX WOLF

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

December is here and we're quickly coming to the end of another year. At the end of an event or dinner at a restaurant, you may get a survey asking you to reflect on how things went and what can be improved. As we turn the calendar to 2025, perhaps it would be good for us to survey ourselves as followers of Jesus.

As Christians, we should want to become more and more like Jesus. How can we measure our progress? I suggest asking ourselves four questions based on the apostle Paul's poem from Philippians 2:5-8 describing the life and ministry of Jesus.

- 1) How much are you willing to give away? In verse 6, Paul writes, "Though he was God, [Jesus] did not think of equality with God as something to cling to. Instead, he gave up his divine privileges..." (New Living Translation). Have you ever thought about all that Jesus gave up in order to save us? He set aside his heavenly entitlements to become human. What are you willing to set aside in order to do the work God has asked you do?
- 2) How often do you serve others? In verse 7, Paul writes, "[Jesus] took the humble position of a servant..." Jesus was always serving others: he taught, washed feet, healed the sick, and fed the hungry. Do you look for ways to help and serve those in need?
- 3) How well do you obey God? In verse 8, Paul writes, "When [Jesus] appeared in human form, he humbled himself in obedience to God..." Jesus was obedient to what his Father required him to do. Do you do your best to live out what God commands of you?
- 4) Are you willing to endure hardships? At the end of verse 8, Paul writes, "and [Jesus] died a criminal's death on a cross." The Christian life isn't always easy. Being spiritually mature means we know that we may have to endure difficulties because of our faith. But we can find strength knowing that God can bring good out of our afflictions for ourselves and for others.

I encourage you to reflect on these questions regarding your faith journey through this last year as well as in the year(s) to come. The more we are willing to grow in these areas, the more we will look like Jesus.



As he opened the box, the father was embarrassed by his earlier overreaction, now regretting how he had punished her.





Statewide Senior Health counseling will be providing assistance only via phone due to Covid again this year. Call 402-444-6617 and Volunteers Assisting Seniors will set up a phone appointment. Rick Scofield (who is an official VAS Volunteer) has kindly been helping those in our congregation by phone or in person with their choices. Also, if you're approaching 65 or retirement, Rick can provide Medicare counseling about the decisions you need to make.


