



FROM PASTOR ALEX WOLF

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

Over the summer months, there will be education opportunities on Sunday mornings after the worship service about the history and polity (or organization) of our congregation, Northwest Hills Church, and our denomination, the United Church of Christ. There's a lot to cover regarding those topics and we'll only scratch the surface. But why is it important to know the history and polity of our own church and our denomination?

I believe we should study history because history doesn't stay behind us. Studying our history helps us understand how events in the past made things the way they are today. With lessons from the past, we not only learn about ourselves and how we came to be, but we also learn how to make wise decisions in the future.

The origin of the United Church of Christ only dates back to 1957, but our history goes back further and is full of interesting stories—the epic journey of the Pilgrims from England to the shores of North America, the waves of emigration by German Protestants seeking spiritual and political freedom, the beginning of the anti-slavery movement, and the exciting movement to reunite divided branches of Christ's church.

Out of that desire for unity, our own congregation of Northwest Hills is a result of the merger of four churches: First Congregational Church of Irvington, Third Congregational (Plymouth) Church, Western Hills United Church of Christ, and Central Park Congregational Church. Within our pews are stories of homesteaders and farmers, businessmen and women, teachers and pastors who have made an impact on our community in the name of Jesus.

If these little tidbits piqued your interest, I encourage you to join in on these sessions. God has done amazing things within Northwest Hills and the United Church of Christ—they're stories worth telling and knowing!

We began on Sunday, May 18th after worship with the history of the United Church of Christ. Feel free to come for one session or for all of them!




