special requests for needed items — and special holidays like the Thanksgiving meals — is the Holy Cross Lutheran Church Food Pantry (4117 Terrace Dr.), and our wonderful friend there, Rohn Collins, is the one who picks up our donations.

The other one is the Project Hope Food Pantry, located at Shepherd of the Hills Lutheran Church (off N. 60th St.). We support them through the "Direct Your Dollars" Program at all Family Fare grocery stores. When you bring your Family Fare receipts to the drop-off box in the Commons, these are aggregated with other receipts, and when hitting a certain amount, Family Fare cuts a sizeable check to Project Hope — the last one was \$1,000! — so that Project Hope can purchase much needed pantry items! So both are a win-win situation when the body of Christ partners together to meet the needs of the community! Whichever way you choose to help — either by bringing non-perishables or receipts — you are blessing others!



FROM PASTOR ALEX WOLF

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

For my article this month, I'd like to share with you a modern take on a beloved text of Scripture. In Christ's love, Pastor Alex

Psalm 23 (rewritten) by Rebecca Garrett Pace

Jesus is my shepherd, and I honestly feel sorry for him because I can be quite a stubborn sheep. I shall not want. Or, that's the way it should work, but yet I always want for more. I'm working on it. He makes me lie down in greet pastures; he leads me beside still waters; he restores my soul. Jesus is teaching me how to care—to care for myself, so that I can then care for others. To care for the earth, so I can live in green pastures with still waters and not make a mess of them just because I can. To care for my soul, which is fed by gratitude and joy and kindness.

He leads me in right paths for his name's sake. Unfortunately, he keeps talking too softly for me to hear him, so I keep having to guess what the right paths are, and go on a hunch, and ask for forgiveness

when I get it wrong.

Even though I walk through the darkest valley, I fear no evil—well, that's just wishful thinking. I fear all the time. All the things. So much fear. But I am learning how to sit in the darkness and be open to what I might learn form it. And really the most important bit is that...you are with me. Your music, your friendship, your wisdom, your words, your kindness, your presence through others—they comfort me.

You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies, and you tell me that there's extra room at the table. And it's actually your table and not mine, so I should scoot over and make room and invite my enemies to eat with me and give them the last piece of homemade bread and extra butter because that's what you would do. Which is annoying, but I know you're right.

You anoint my head with oil—you protect and love me, you nurture, you guide, you heal me. My cup overflows. God, I am grateful. I am so incredibly overwhelmed by goodness in my life. Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life, and I shall dwell in the house of

the Lord my whole life long. And when the goodness and mercy are obscured, O God, help me know you're still there. Always. Forever. Amen.




