### **FROM PASTOR ALEX WOLF**

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

Beginning Friday, July 11th through Tuesday, July 15th, I will be in Kansas City, Missouri as a delegate of the Nebraska Conference at the 35th General Synod of the United Church of Christ. This will my fourth time being a delegate at General Synod. Every two years, General Synod brings together faithful members from across the United Church of Christ in one location to seek the Holy Spirit's movement and guidance on how to be the church in our current time and into the future. General Synod helps to accomplish our denomination's motto taken from Jesus' prayer in John 17:21, "that they may all be one."

What happens at General Synod? Delegates gather to worship, to have fellowship, and to conduct the business of the church. The business of the church includes electing national officers and discerning pronouncements and resolutions. Pronouncements are statements of Christian conviction on a matter of moral or social principle. As of the time of writing this article, there are no proposed pronouncements for this upcoming General Synod. For an example, a past pronouncement at the 19th General Synod that met in St. Louis in 1993 was a call for the United Church of Christ to be a multiracial and multicultural church.

Resolutions come in two types. A *resolution of witness* is an expression concerning a moral, ethical, or religious matter confronting the church, the nation, or the world. For example, this year's General Synod includes a resolution of witness recognizing the continually changing world of mental health and one outlining a response to Christian persecution in India. The second kind of resolution is a *prudential resolution*, which is for the purpose of church structure and policy. Two prudential resolutions being discerned this year are full communion between the United Church of Christ and the Evangelical Church in Germany as well as one discerning full communion with the United Evangelical Church of Puerto Rico.

An important aspect of General Synod is that it speaks to the church but not for it. We are a church in covenant with one another, so we are expected to listen closely to the pronouncements and resolutions made at General Synod and discern what they mean for our ministry in our context. I plan to make time in the next month or two to share with you what happened at this year's General Synod. Check the church's news for more information.

As delegates gather in Kansas City this month, I would ask that you keep us in your prayers. Please pray that the Spirit move among us as we do the work of the church for 2025 and beyond (as well as enjoy some good barbecue!).
