





#### FROM PASTOR ALEX WOLF

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

As Andy Williams first sang in 1963, "It's the most wonderful time of the year!' All around the Omaha area, trees and houses are being decorated with lights and tinsel, stockings are being hung with care over fireplaces, classic Christmas movies are playing on repeat on television, stores and malls are overrun with shoppers. Yes, it's a crazy time! In case you're really feeling the stress of the holidays, I thought of four tips that might help you better enjoy the Christmas season.

1) Set realistic expectations. I don't know of too many families that have a perfect Christmas like they do on the Hallmark Channel movies. And you know what? That's ok. Your Christmas celebrations don't have to be "perfect." The turkey might not turn out just right and there will probably be family drama. Those things come with the season. Try to have the best time that you can.

2) Know your limits. There's only so much time to cram in shopping, baking, gift wrapping, and visiting family and friends. You can't do everything, so why would you try? Figure out what's most important to do. Also, remember to sometimes say "no." Don't be so hard on yourself and do what you can.

3) Slow down. This tip is an extension of the last one. It's easy to become overwhelmed by all the tasks and traditions. But remember that this holiday is for you, too. Take some time to rest and relax. As people of faith, we must remember to take sabbath time. God rested after the work of creation; you should rest too.

4) Remember the reason for the season. As you revel in the midst of all the lights, decorations, singing of Christmas carols, shopping, and other holiday celebrations, I ask you to also reflect on and remember what Christmas is really all about: the birth of our Savior Jesus, who is Emmanuel, "God with us." Take some time to celebrate Jesus and all he's done for us.
