

CRAFTERS! We're taking a break from the Wednesday craft group during January, with plans to reconvene in February.





ALL LADIES GROUPS/CIRCLES are taking a break during January and February. See you all in March!

Relationships: If you'd like to be more social, make a resolution to make new friendships or deepen existing ones, whether it be family, friends, or even co-workers.


Fun: If you'd like to have more fun this year, make a resolution to take a vacation to somewhere you've never been, find a new hobby, or go to an event.




From our Northwest Hills Preschool...

Our very own.....Northwest Hills Church Christmas miracle!


Northwest Hills Church family, our great God is still in the miracle-working business! The great adventure actually started before Christmas: on Monday December 22nd. About mid-morning I received a call from Sue Slowik. She was distraught because a necklace she had worn to church the day before (on the 21st) was missing, and she was hoping that perhaps it had fallen off her person somewhere in the church. I told her that I had just picked up the entire sanctuary, but would go check again, and also check the Commons area, where Sue would normally hang her coat.

A little back story: The necklace was very precious to Sue. It was actually an old locket, with pictures of Sue's mom's (Gerry Conry) parents, Addie and Paul Taylor. Sue didn't know when the picture was taken, but her mom had kept it all these years. Sue didn't know her mom had it until she found it while cleaning out her mom's house after cleaning it out about a year ago to get ready to sell. Gerry's father had died when Gerry was 13 years old. He was waiting to board a streetcar downtown in 1945 when he was killed by a hit-and-run driver. Sue has a newspaper article Gerry had kept about the sad and tragic event.

Sue had worn the necklace for the first time on Sunday, December 21st. Afterwards, she went to the cemetery to place Christmas flowers at her mom, step-dad and dad's resting places. Sue didn't realize the necklace had come off until she was driving back home. It was not in her car or purse. So Sue called the church Monday morning. Jo Morton also called, and offered to meet Sue at the church to keep looking. (I had to run home and let my Christmas present from my kids — a 6 month old Goldendoodle puppy — out to potty — when I returned, Sue and Pastor Alex were out in the front parking lot, having just scoured the outdoors as well). Jo Morton came to the church to pick up Sue and accompany her to the cemetery, to see if by ANY chance it was there. Sue was not very hopeful: outdoors, it could have been ANYWHERE, and with the terrific winds we've been having here in Omaha. Jo drove Sue to the cemetery to check. Sue was convinced it was lost, but Jo kept reassuring her, "it will be found" and said that she was praying to St. Anthony** (see previous page if you are not familiar with this saint). Sue and Jo looked, but didn't find the locket. As they were leaving the cemetery, they stopped by the office: Sue was hoping they'd take her information just in case the locket was found.

The ladies headed back to the church. Just a couple minutes after leaving the exit, Sue received a phone call from the gentleman in the cemetery office: he said he believed her necklace had just been turned in by an employee who had found it that morning! The girls turned around and went back immediately. When he showed it to Sue, she was overjoyed and tearful: so grateful and blessed that the necklace she lost at the cemetery the day before was found by an employee, turned in to the office and returned the next day! Sue says "thank you, Jesus!" and thanks to her dear friend, Jo Morton.

Criteria for Consideration:

- New applicants must have participated in church activities at Northwest Hills Church
- Exhibiting an active commitment of faith
- Application to an institution of higher learning
- Completed written application
- Completed recommendation letter(s) (see application form)
- Interview with committee
- Priority will be given to applicant not previously awarded this scholarship
